And while there are many options to choose from, we will explore the most popular selections here in our **Top 5 Dwarf Shrubs**.

5. Cherry Blossom Deutzia

After years of breeding, Proven Winners was finally able to develop a pink flowering deutzia! A shower of elegant pink flowers creates a carpet of color in spring on this low growing, mounding shrub. Cherry Blossom grows 12-24 inches tall in full sun or partial shade. Rich burgundy-purple fall color make it a great choice that butterflies adore!

4. My Monet & Spilled Wine Weigela

It's hard to break a tie with these dwarf weigelas, so I decided to lump them together. Weigelas provide beautiful shows of flowers in spring while showing off colorful foliage all season long.

My Monet grows 12-18" tall and boasts a contrasting variegated foliage underneath pink flowers.

Spilled Wine has dark purple leaves all season that contrast spectacularly with pink spring flowers. It'll grow about 2 feet tall.

3. Little Henry Sweetspire

Little Henry Sweetspire is a useful native that'll adapt to almost any location. It'll grow 2-3 feet tall in full sun, full shade, or anywhere in between. Lightly scented, pure white flowers shoot like fireworks in the early summer horizon. Little Henry foliage turns a brilliant multitude of oranges and reds in the fall, making it a rewarding experience throughout all seasons.

2. Bobo & Little Quick Fire Hydrangeas

How do you break a tie between the top 2 selling hydrangeas? Answer: You don't! Bobo and Little Quick Fire are newer varieties that have just exploded onto the scene and into landscapes everywhere. And for good reason!

Bobo grows 2-3 feet tall with engulfing white flowers all summer. Flowers are held up on strong stems, making flower flop nearly obsolete! Towards fall, flowers take on a pink hue. Incredibly hardy too!

Little Quick Fire is the baby brother to Quick Fire Hydrangea. It'll grow 3-5 feet naturally, but can easily be kept on the shorter side. Flowers start off white in mid June and transition to deep burgundy red, providing a spectacular show throughout summer!

1. Magic Carpet Spirea

Magic Carpet Spirea explodes with color from spring through fall! New foliage growth in spring shoots out red and turns bright yellow as it matures, making a striking contrast all year as it grows. Clusters of deep pink flowers cover the compact, dwarf shrub in early summer. In fall, the foliage takes on rich russet tones that remain colorful well into November. Grows 18-24 inches tall and is tough as nails. Perfect shrub for full sun color!
